Our community of listeners helps us understand the big tech stories in the news and how they impact culture and society for all of us. We focus uniquely on the untold, often neglected, digital stories around the world.

Plenty of podcasts report on Silicon Valley and the latest gadgets. But we peer deeper into today's information society, bringing you stories about technology in people's everyday lives, not just in the world's wealthy regions but also in low and middle income countries. SOEP

Somewhere On Earth Productions or SOEP does what is says in its name. We are in effect SOAP: clean, new, accessible, fresh and vital. Our first SOEP podcast is about technology across the planet. The aim is to expand on this to global health and the environment. As we've seen with the COVID-19 pandemic our health is a planet wide issue that cannot be managed in isolation by individual nations.... The same is true of the environment, no one on Earth can ignore the impact of climate change and the only solution is for the world's population to respond as one. This is the underlying theme of SOEP - our one planet story and the impact of our one and only planet's future.

She was the Editor of the Ebola Regional Response Unit for BBC Media Action, travelling to Liberia during the 2015 Global Ebola Pandemic and managing a team of 30 reporters, while editing and producing a weekly radio programme "Kick Ebola from Liberia" in Liberian English. Ania's first language is Polish, she is fluent in English and she studied Biology and French at University.
