As a research specialist, she works closely with the University of Stellenbosch's Africa Doctoral Academy to build capacity. René supervises doctoral students in Digital Transformation and Complexity and regularly offers research design and research methods workshops having received several merit awards in research. She works as a strategist, researcher, and systems engineer in the international arena based on her extensive international experience across the globe at universities in the United States, the United Kingdom, France and across Africa. 
